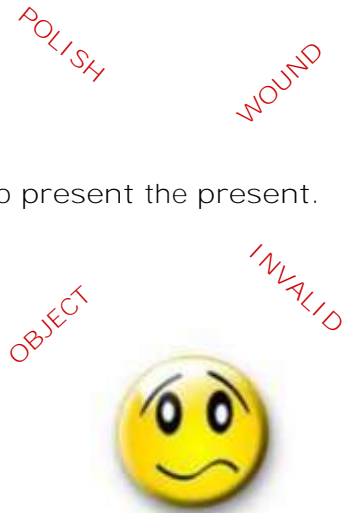

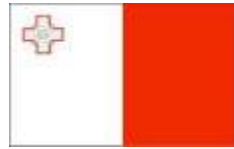
There is one two-letter word that probably has more meanings than any other word. That word is UP.

NCR Chairman and CEO Bill Nuti honored with Atlantic Legal Foundation's Annual Award

Nuti recognized for his "strategic vision, integrity and demonstrated leadership in bringing innovation to the global marketplace"

NEW YORK, NY – (April 3, 2014) – Bill Nuti, Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and President of NCR (NYSE: NCR) was honored Wednesday in New York City with the Atlantic Legal Foundation's Annual Award for 2013 in recognition of his "strategic vision, integrity and demonstrated leadership in bringing innovation to the global marketplace." Each year, since 1988, the Atlantic Legal Foundation has honored a person who exemplifies the ideals and principles of public service and private enterprise.

Since joining NCR in 2005, Nuti has orchestrated a multi-year reinvention of the iconic company, transforming NCR into the global leader in consumer transaction technologies. Marines Install NCR Computer Network

On April 14, in Washington, D. C., a nationwide NCR Computer network was placed in operation designed to streamline the handling of Marine Corps personnel.

The new data processing system consists of three high-speed NCR 304 electronic computers. One is located at Marine Headquarters in the Navy Annex in Washington; one has been installed at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and the third at Camp Pendleton, California. All three computers are linked together by leased wires.

Under the new system, electronic service records will be maintained on about 475,000 Marines, both regular and reserve. Over 150 separate pieces of information about each man will be contained on less than two inches of magnetic tape.

A total of twenty-three million facts will be stored on only 20 reels of tape that could be fitted into a small suitcase. A similar mass of data recorded on punched cards would require a stack of cards higher than the Empire State Building.

Each of the three installations in the system is capable of turning out reports at a speed equal to the output of 290 typists. The new data-processing equipment will make possible a faster and more efficient mobilization of the Marine Corps Reserve in the event of war or national emergency.

In combat situations, the system will provide Marine Corps Headquarters with speedier, more accurate reports on battle losses and will expedite movement of replacements into critical areas.

One of the system's principal routine tasks will be to assist the Marine Corps in processing over a million changes annually in its personnel records. This equipment will also help prepare training plans, budget and

allotment checks, and will handle a variety of other data-processing jobs.

A specialized task of the computers will be to locate Marines with unusual or special skills. In a few hours, for example, this system could identify every Marine who speaks a foreign language, including those familiar with specific dialects.

Any one of the three installations will be able to take over the entire Marine Corps record-keeping job in the event the other two are unable to function due to enemy action or other factors.

The installation in Washington will serve as master control center for the three-station data-processing network. The Camp Pendleton computer will handle personnel records on Marines stationed west of the Mississippi River to the border of India. The Camp Lejeune equipment will maintain and process data on Marines in other parts of the world.

At the Washington ceremonies, Mr. Allyn said, "The National Cash Register Company is proud of the fact that the first installation of its electronic data processing system has been made by the Marines.

"For our Company, this system represents the culmination of years of effort and in the investment of millions of dollars in research and development. It is a long step forward in our constant effort to better meet the challenge of the growing amount of paper work which faces both government and business.

"From the standpoint of the Marines, this installation is evidence of the determination of the Armed Forces to secure maximum efficiency in all its phases of operation."

The installation of this NCR equipment is expected to save the Corps hundreds of thousands of dollars annually.
